Arabic has to be presented in transliteration (DMG style; see <a href="https://www.dmg-web.de/page/transliteration\_en">https://www.dmg-web.de/page/transliteration\_en</a>). References to online publications are welcome.

The ZDMG board will select the most suitable articles from those submitted and will publish them in the above-mentioned issues.

All selected articles will, furthermore, undergo a thorough screening regarding form and content.
